The Ministry of Defence has stated that Iraq's electricity system – which powers its hospitals, water treatment and sewage plants - 'could be a military target, despite warnings that its destruction would cause a humanitarian tragedy' (*Independent on Sunday*, 2 Feb). **According to Oxfam such attacks on Iraq's vital infrastructure would breach the Geneva Convention with 'drastic' consequences for Iraq's civilian population.**

Defence Secretary Geoff Hoon has stated that British forces will use 'cluster bombs and depleted uranium (DU) shells in Iraq if necessary' (*Independent*, 21 March). **The use of such weapons could have a devastating impact on ordinary Iraqis, continuing long after the war has finished.**
