We are an informal group, rambling at weekends during Full Term. There is no subscription: simply turn up on the day! New ramblers are welcome at any time. The rambles explore the villages and countryside surrounding Cambridge. We alternate with half-day rambles on Saturdays and full-day rambles on Sundays. Between terms we usually organise walking holidays further afield. Items to bring/wear are: boots or strong shoes; waterproofs; money for the train or bus; refreshment and a packed lunch for Sunday rambles (i.e. Don't rely on a Pub Lunch.).

Saturday 14th October

Introductory Ramble to Grantchester

9.5 km

Out along the Cam and back through Trumpington. Grantchester is a charming and famous little village south of Cambridge, often visited in a punt. Meet at the Mill Lane bridge at 1330.

Sunday 15th October

Harlow to Bishops Stortford

18 km

This is a new walk for the Rambling Club that weaves a path through castern Hertfordshire, following the river Ash for a few kilometers.

Out: Train at 0955 to Harlow Town, arrive 1045.

Back: Train at 1706 from Bishops Stortford to Cambridge at 1746.

Saturday 21st October

Audley End to Gt Chesterford

9.5 km

This pleasant walk in Essex features 120 m high hills and a stretch of Roman Road. It has been a very popular walk in previous years.

Out: Train at 1325 to Audley End, arrive 1339.

Back: Train at 1645 from Gt Chesterford to Cambridge at 1702.

Sunday 29th October

Royston Circular

15 km

Climb to the dizzy height of 160 m at Therfield for views towards Cambridge 25 km away, and visit the site of an ancient castle.

Out: Train at 1000 to Royston, arrive 1017.

Back: Train at 1528 from Royston to Cambridge at 1551.

Saturday 4th November

Lolworth Circular

13 km

This walk through gently undulating coutryside and peaceful villages passes Childerley Hall, where Charles I was imprisoned in 1647 and a nature reserve with a spring of ferruginous water.

Out: Cambus 155 at 1245 to Bar Hill, arrive 1311.

Back: Cambus 155 at 1619 from Bar Hill to Cambridge at 1740.

Sunday 12th November

Mordens Circular

21 km

Features of this walk on the Cambridgeshire/Hertfordshire border are an Elizabethan gatehouse, the source of the river Cam, and stone-carved graffiti from the plague ridden villagers of 14th century Ashwell.

Out: Train at 0900 to Ashwell & Morden, arrive 0924.

Back: Train at 1622 from Ashwell & Morden to Cambridge at 1651.

Saturday 18th November

Toft Circular

11 kn

Visit one of the highest points of south-west Cambridgeshire for views of Cambridge and the church towers of Great and Little Eversden.

Out: Cambus 118 at 1200 to Toft, arrive 1228.

Back: Cambus 118 at 1524 from Toft to Cambridge at 1552.

Sunday 26th November

Newport to Elsenham

16 1...

This is another new walk. We pass a wildlife park at Widdington and follow a dismantled railway on the approach to Elsenham.

Out: Train at 0955 to Newport, arrive 1016.

Back: Train at 1515 from Elsenham to Cambridge at 1546.

Saturday 2nd December

Stapleford to Linton

12.5 km

Yet another new walk for the club that follows the Granta through Babraham and the Abingtons.

Out: Train at 1225 to Shelford, arrive 1230.

Back: Cambus 113 at 1522 from Linton to Cambridge at 1602.
