CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY RAMBLING CLUB

Easter Term 2007

Welcome back to the Rambling Club. Once again, we invite you to leave the city for a few hours this term, and enjoy the surrounding countryside with us. The pace of our walks is generally easy, as our main aim is to relax and appreciate the local scenery and villages, and we have tried to provide a mixture of walks of different lengths. We usually stop at a village pub en route, but you should bring a packed lunch and a drink anyway as occasionally a walk doesn't pass a pub, or we find that a pub is closed. Strong boots and waterproof clothing are also recommended. Your only expense is the bus or train fare (given below), plus our £1 annual membership fee. There is no need to sign up in advance to join any of this term's walks (apart from the Varsity March at the end of term) – just turn up at the time and place given. Our meeting points are:

Bus/Coach: At the corner of Drummer Street and Emmanuel Street. Train: In the main hall of Cambridge Railway Station.

Saturday 28th April: "Where are we going to on this expotition? Expedition, Silly Old Bear. It's got an 'x' in it" King's Lynn to Downham Market 12 miles **Contact: Sam**

We start the Easter term with a walk alongside the river Great Ouse from King's Lynn to Downham Market. Heading out of King's Lynn along the South Quay we'll take in some of the more historic parts of the town before picking up the Fen Rivers Way. This takes us along the river and through the villages of Wiggenhall St Germans, Wiggenhall St Mary Magdalene and Stowbridge, before we reach Downham Market for the train home.

Meet: 09:15 at the railway station for the 09.33 train to King's Lynn Return: 17.09 train from Downham Market, arriving back in Cambridge at 17.44 **Cost:** £8.50, or £5.60 with a railcard [Return to King's Lynn]

Sunday 6th May: "A visit to Oliver Cromwell's Hole" Cambourne Circular 15 miles

From Cambourne we head first to the villages of Caxton and Bourne. From here we follow the "Porters Way" past Oliver Cromwell's Hole, before visiting Hayley Wood and the nature reserve just outside the village of Little Gransden. We then follow "Dick and Dolls Lane" back to Caxton and so to Cambourne for the bus back to Cambridge.

Meet: 10.00 outside the Crowne Plaza Hotel on Downing Street for the 10.10 bus to Cambourne Return: 17.43 bus from Cambourne, arriving back in Cambridge at 18.05 **Cost:** Approximately £4.50 for the bus fare

Come and join us for a drink and a ramble of the conversational variety.

Another chance to visit Wimpole Hall and sample the National Trust ice cream! From Shepreth railway station we first visit the village of Orwell before heading to the Old Folly at Wimpole Hall where we will stop for lunch. After stopping for ice creams in the stable block we will head south to Whaddon and then back to Shepreth.

Meet: 09.30 at the railway station for the 09.45 train to Shepreth Return: 16.30 train from Shepreth, arriving back in Cambridge at 16.46 **Cost:** £3.50, or £2.30 with a railcard [Return to Shepreth]

Sunday 20th May: "Four Rivers and a Windmill" **Downham Market Circular**

Leaving Downham Market, we walk South along the River Ouse, crossing two rivers at Denver Sluice and continuing until we meet the River Wissey. We follow the Wissey into the village of Hilgay, where we stop at picnic tables by the river for lunch in the company of the local ducks. After lunch we walk through the hamlet of Fordham and on to Denver windmill, a restored and fully working 19th century mill, complete with tearoom! Suitably refreshed, we walk through Denver and Downham Market to catch the train home.
