There is no need to sign up in advance to join a walk, and your only expense is the bus/train fare to the start point for each ramble, plus our 1 pound annual membership fee.

Saturday 29th January

Stowmarket circular 10 miles Contact: <u>Anneliese</u> Out: 1009 train to Stowmarket Return: 1658 train from Stowmarket, arriving back at 1801

Taking the river path south-west from Stowmarket, we skirt Combs Wood and cross farmland to the village of Great Finborough, where we stop for lunch. Looping north after lunch, we pass Onehouse Hall and make our way through woodland back to Stowmarket.

Sunday 6th February

Royston circular 10.5 miles Contact: <u>Simon</u> Out: 1027 train to Royston Return: 1612 train from Royston, arriving back at 1633

We cross Therfield Heath on the edge of Royston and then climb a wooded hillside, heading south towards Therfield village where we will stop for lunch. We then continue south-east following the Chain Walk for a short distance. On reaching the village of Buckland, we turn due north towards Reed, and then gradually decend towards Royston following the Hertfordshire way.

Saturday 12th February

Oakham - Stamford 13.5 miles Contact: <u>Matthew</u> Out: 1005 train to Oakham Return: 1716 train from Stamford, arriving back at 1838

We head eastward from Oakham along the Hereward Way, and join the Rutland Cycle Way, which runs along the northern edge of Rutland Water with fine views. After lunch at the White

Horse Inn at Empingham, we continue through open countryside to join the River Welland for the last two miles into Stamford.

Note: The train fare for this walk is more expensive than usual; £10.15 with a railcard.

Passing Anne of Cleves' house in Haverhill, we proceed to the village of Birdbrook for a lunch stop at the charming pub, The Plough. Then we pass through Moyn's Park to Steeple Bumpstead and its 19th century lockup, and return from there to Haverhill.

Starting from Swaffham Bulbeck, we head west to the village of Lode, and from there across Stow cum Quy Fen to Horningsea, where we will stop for lunch. We then follow the River Cam into Cambridge. Join us for pancakes afterwards in David's room (50A King Street) - feel free to bring your own toppings!

Sunday 12th March

Great Shelford circular 11 miles Contact: <u>Owen</u> Out: 1005 bus to Great Shelford Return: 1544 bus from Great Shelford, arriving back at 1600

From Great Shelford, we roughly follow the course of the River Granta upstream to the village of Babraham, where we will stop for lunch. We walk on to Little Abington and then follow the course of a Roman road to the ancient hill fort of Wandlebury atop the optimistically named Gog Magog Hills, before returning to Great Shelford for the bus.
