

Saturday 17th February: *“Wandering to Wimpole”* **11 miles** **Contact: Victoria**
Meldreth to Shepreth via Wimpole Hall

Starting from Meldreth, we head towards Whaddon, from where we pick up the Harcamlow way. This takes us to the famous Wimpole Hall Avenue, which we follow, for almost its entire length, on the approach to Wimpole Hall. The avenue is 3km long, and we should be able to see the impressive hall at the head of it during our approach. In the afternoon, we continue on towards Orwell, and then through the fields to Barrington, before catching the train home from Shepreth.

Return: 15.11 train from Shepreth, arriving back in Cambridge at 15.26.

Sandy to Biggleswade

Heading north out of Sandy along a roman road we wind round through Potton and Gamlingay to Wrestlingworth, where we will stop for lunch. After lunch we turn south west toward Biggleswade for our train home.
