# Sunday 17th October Cambridge – Waterbeach 6 miles Contact: Simon

Our traditional introductory ramble. We follow the course of the Cam from Magdalene Bridge to the pub at Waterbeach.

#### Sunday 24th October Haverhill – Steeple Bumstead 10.5 miles Contact: Laura

Passing Anne of Cleves' house in Haverhill, we proceed to the village of Birdbrook for a lunch stop at the charming pub, The Plough. Then we pass through Moyn's Park to Steeple Bumstead and its 19th century lockup, and return from there to Haverhill.

Out: 0925 bus to Haverhill Return: 1625 bus from Haverhill, arriving Cambridge 1718

#### Saturday 30th October Grafham Water circular 12 miles Contact: Anneliese

This walk circumnavigates Grafham Water, the only respectable stretch of water in the vicinity of Cambridge. The lake is bordered by interesting nature reserves. We will start and finish walking in the town of Buckden, which boasts the historic towers in which Henry VIII imprisoned Katherine of Aragon.

Out: 0925 bus to Huntingdon Return: 1705 bus from Huntingdon, arriving Cambridge 1740

#### Saturday 13th November Wicken Fen 11.5 miles Contact: Laura

We start from Burwell, skirting St Edmunds Fen to the village of Wicken for a lunch stop. Then we walk around Wicken Fen, Britain's oldest nature reserve, and from there down Reach Lode.

Out: 1000 bus to Burwell Return: 1625 bus from Reach

#### Sunday 21th November Epping Forest

We head east from Cheshunt, passing briefly through the Lee Valley Park, then crossing the wooded undulating countryside of south—west Essex. We enter Epping Forest on its north edge, and walk several miles south—west through the forest, stopping at a pub in the centre of the forest. When we leave the forest, we turn north—west and return to the valley of the River Lee at Enfield Lock.

Out: 0850 train to Cheshunt Return: 1632 train from Enfield Lock, arriving back at 1728

Note: The train fare will be more expensive than usual; 8.20 with a railcard.

# Sunday 28th November Madingley circular 7 miles Contact: Owen

Leaving Cambridge, we will walk to Coton for a lunch stop, then go on to Madingley where we will walk around the grounds of Madingley Hall. We shall return to Cambridge by Wrangling Corner (yes, really) and Girton College. Even though this walk is relatively short, the end of the walk is likely to be muddy, so suitable footwear is still recommended.
