To new ramblers and returning members alike, welcome to the Rambling Club! We invite you to leave the city for a few hours this term to enjoy the surrounding countryside with us. The pace of our walks is generally easy, as our main aim is to relax and appreciate the local scenery and villages. We sometimes stop at a village pub en route, but **you should bring a packed lunch (except for half-day rambles) and a bottle of water** anyway. Strong boots, waterproofs, and warm clothing are also recommended. Your only expense is the bus or train fare (given below), plus our £1 annual membership fee. There is no need to sign up in advance to join any of this term's walks — just turn up at the time and place given. Our meeting points (unless otherwise noted) are: **Bus**: at the entrance to Drummer Street bus station, near the *taxi rank / public toilets*. **Train**: in the main hall of the Cambridge Railway Station.

Saturday 12th October "Freshers' Ramble to Waterbeach" *Cambridge to Waterbeach* 10 km / 6 miles Contact: David This is a gentle afternoon stroll along the River Cam, ideal both for new members who want to learn more about the club and meet some fellow walking enthusiasts, and for existing members who want to swap stories of their summer travels. At the end of the walk we'll stop briefly at the pub in Waterbeach before catching the train back to Cambridge.

Meet: 14:00 on the Quayside, next to Magdalene Bridge

Return: 17:35 train from Waterbeach, arriving back at 17:44

Cost: £1.70 (£1.20 with a railcard)

Sunday 20th October "Rambling to Grantchester" *Cambridge circular* 9 km / 5.5 miles Contact: David This easy afternoon stroll will take us to two tranquil villages just outside Cambridge. From Great St Mary's Church, we will head to the river, where we will pick up a path to take us behind the Botanic Gardens, and back to Trumpington Road, which leads to the village of that name. We'll then follow the winding country lane past Byron's Pool to Grantchester, where notable intellectuals of the early 20th century gathered for discussion and countryside inspiration. After stopping for refreshment at the village tea rooms or a pub, we will follow the footpath along the river back to Cambridge, via Newnham.

Meet: 13:00 outside Great St Mary's Church

Return: Back to the city centre by 17:00

Saturday 26th October "Rambling over a lot of Water" Southend-on-Sea Circular 15 km / 9.5 miles Contact: Christine Today we'll walk to the end of the world's longest pleasure pier. It's a 2.68 mile round-trip, so we'll spend a significant portion of the afternoon's ramble walking with water below us. There's even a pier railway to take the less able-bodied ramblers from one end to the other (ticket price £4.00). Before stepping off of the old wood and iron pier back onto dry land, you'll have the opportunity to Adopt a Plank. Next, we'll walk around the resort town of Southend-on-Sea and along the sandy beach and coast before ending up at a seaside restaurant right before the sun sets.

Thursday 31st October "Uncovering the Ghosts of Hertfordshire" *Knebworth to Hitchin* 18 km / 11 miles Contact: David On this most haunted of nights, we invite you to join us for a tour of some of Hertfordshire's dark and ghostly corners. We first visit the grounds of Knebworth House, haunted by a Yellow Boy whose appearance foretells a violent death. Later we will stop at the ruins of the 14th century Minsden Chapel, originally a

Later we will stop at the ruins of the 14th century Minsden Chapel, originally a resting stop for pilgrims and now said to be haunted by the ghosts of a monk, a murdered nun and the historian Reginald Hine. Finally, assuming we still have our lives and our sanity intact, we head north through the village of St Ippollytts to Hitchin. As this is a night hike, you may wish to bring a torch and some food for dinner. Dressing up in Halloween costume is encouraged but not essential!
